This will take many years to complete and Satan will attack, but we believe without a doubt that God wants this done. God has been bringing together a team of people to work on this project and I look forward to seeing how He will continue to bring it all together. We are ready to break ground on the translation center and are just waiting for a permit that will allow us to do so.

MISSIONARIES TO SOUTH SUDAN

Peter Kosgei and his family has almost finished raising all their support and are in the process of moving to Northern Kenya near the border of South Sudan. This has been a long time prayer that has been delayed by the civil war in South Sudan. We believe living in Kenya, near the border will allow them to begin working in that needy country. Along with working in South Sudan, he will minister in the Kakuma Refugee camp, the largest refugee camp in East Africa, and to the Turkana tribe. The Turkana people are over one million in population and have not had much evangelist work done amongst them in comparison to other people groups in Kenya. They are a hard people group to reach, still living an animistic life as they have throughout their history. The Kosgei family are members of the Grace Bible Baptist Church and we will be working closely with this family in this mission endeavor.
